


Bakewell Union Workhouse - Record of Inmates and Staff, 1871

Bakewell Poor Law Union and Bakewell Union Workhouse – Background Information

The Poor Law Amendment Act (more commonly known as the 'New Poor Law' Act) of 1834 aimed to create a more uniform, centralised system for dealing with poor relief. At a local level, parishes were grouped into together into Poor Law Unions run by Boards of Guardians.

Following the New Poor Law Act, the Bakewell Poor Law Union came into being in July 1838 and represented 50 Derbyshire parishes (including: Abney and Abney Grange, Aldwarke, Ashford, Bakewell, Baslow and Bubnell, Beesley, Birchover, Brushfield, Calver, Chelmorton, Cromford, Curbar, Darley Dale, Edensor, Eyam Woodlands, Flagg, Foolow, Froggart, Grange Mill [Ironbrook Grange], Gratton, Grindlow, Haddon Over, Halzebadge, Harthill, Hartington, Hassop, Hathersage, Highlow, Great Hucklow, Little Hucklow, Litton, Great Longston, Little Longston, Matlock, Middleton-by-Youlgreave, Moneyash, Nether Padley, Pillsley, Rowsley and Alport, Sheldon, Stanton, Stoke, Stoney Middleton, Taddington and Priestcliffe, Tideswell, Wardlow Miers, Wensley and Snitterton, Whestone, Winster).

The New Poor Law system was centred on the workhouse. Rather than being given poor relief in their own homes, poor people generally could now only get assistance if they entered the Union Workhouse. Conditions in Union Workhouses were deliberately harsh to ensure only the very desperate applied to enter. Families could be split up and housed in different parts of the workhouse, inmates of all ages were forced to do hard menial labour (such as breaking up stones) and children could be hired out to work in factories, mines, etc. In October 1838, the Bakewell Poor Law Union set up a sub-committee to provide a temporary workhouse for the union. At first the Union rented a private workhouse at Ashover, and from 1840, it appears they paid for its paupers to be housed in the new Chesterfield Union Workhouse before building their own workhouse at Newholme, Bakewell. The new Bakewell Union Workhouse building was completed in 1841 with capacity for up to 200 inmates. In May 1841, Thomas Gratton and his wife Catherine (of Chesterfield) were elected as first master and matron of the new workhouse. In the early 1900s, in order to try and shake off the stigma of the 'workhouse', the building became known as Bakewell Public Assistance Institution and later, when it passed into the control of the NHS, it became Newholme Hospital. Hardly any records of pauper inmates at Bakewell Union Workhouse survive, however, in addition to lists of inmates which can be obtained from UK Census records, Bakewell Poor Law Union Board of Guardians minute books [which include reference to individual pauper cases], Aug 1838 - Feb 1930 are available (Derbyshire Record Office: D521/W1/1-45).
